

#### **Principal's Report**

**Dear College Community** 

During the term break, Peter Centra and myself were privileged to be invited by the Sisters of Sion to attend their fourth tri-annual Sion Schools International Conference in Paris. The theme of the conference was; "Spaces of Dialogue; the Pedagogical Characteristics of the Schools of Our Lady of Sion".

The Conference was organised by an International Team and facilitated by the French NDS (Notre Dame De Sion) Schools. A significant range of speakers addressed the issues of dialogue from an educational, social, personal and psychological point of view. As part of the conference we were privileged to visit the Notre Dame De Sion – Paris and Notre Dame De Sion Evry. NDS Paris provides education to inner Paris students with ages ranging from Prep to Year 13. NDS Evry is located approximately one hour outside of Paris and is the spiritual home for the Sisters of Sion, including the Sion Cemetery for France in which Theodore Ratisbonne is buried. In addition, these practice exams will enable students to focus on any areas that need improvement for the extremely short amount of time available in Term 4.

We are unable to make these examinations compulsory for students given that they are during school holidays, however they will prove to be a worthwhile experience and students should make every effort to be present and assist the College in its endeavour to provide the best possible preparation prior to the examinations in October/November.

Term 2 is an extremely busy and exciting time of the year at the College with many extracurricular opportunities available to our students. Today we have sixteen Year 7 students representing the College at the 2018 Da Vinci Decathlon. This 'decathlon with a difference' is an academic interschool gala day run in the spirit of an Olympic Decathlon, with events of an academic nature. I am confident that the information you receive as a result of your child's participation in the NAPLAN tests will be valuable in helping you to assess your child's progress in literacy and numeracy. 



### LIONS YOUTH OF THE YEAR

Year 12 student Abbey Walsh was the runner up in the Lions Youth of the Year Quest held in Barooga on the 14th of April. Abbey beat out of 4000 students from around the State who went into the competition.

The Chief Justice of the five member panel, Andrew Gibbs, stated that "as former adviser to a Prime Minister and a Political Lobbyist of some 17 years, I have yet to come across any Year 12 Student as impressive as Abbey, so agreed by the entire panel. Although Abbey was narrowly beaten and became runner up, her mastery of her School's offering, her passion about being involved and the care she spoke about LGBT students was simply amazing. Her overall reflection on Sale and her School was also truly inspiring."

In a letter to Principal Chris Randell, Mr Gibbs said of Abbey, "She has shown herself to be a true leader of your institute, a worthy young woman deserving of her community's praise, given the regard she holds them in and the Brand Ambassador she has shown herself to be."

To get to State, Abbey competed first at Club level and then at the District Final in Trafalgar. At District, Abbey was interviewed by five judges for half an hour discussing activities she participates in under the heading of: Academic, Leadership, Sporting, Cultural activities, Scholarships held, and Achievements and awards. During this interview she was also asked to speak about issues on a local, state, national and international scale, for example, Abbey was asked to discuss Brexit. After the interview process Abbey was then requierd to answer two impromptu questions in front of an audience, with each response to last at least two minutes. Abbey then presented a five minute speech on a topic of her choice, which was Global Poverty and what Australia can do to help solve this issue.

#### Cyberia

On Wednesday, 2nd of May, Brainstorm Productions presented their student wellbeing program 'Cyberia' for Years 7 and 8 students.

This play was powerful and compelling with students enjoying the live theatre experience about cyber bullying and its devastating repercussions. Cyberia depicts two teen characters that are increasingly using texting, tweeting, online gaming, Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, MSN and (embarrassing) selfies to express themselves. In time this takes a nasty twist leading to cyber bullying and the spreading of hurtful rumours online. The characters suddenly realise they can't just press

the "undo" button to save their relationships, reputation or their dignity. Cyberia encouraged students to think carefully before they 'post', 'tweet' or 'snap' and to stop, think and reboot.

Cyberia fits in very well with our student wellbeing SEED pastoral program, with pastoral teacher using curriculum provided by Brainstorm, to explore and discuss some of the themes raised in the performance earlier that day.


