# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

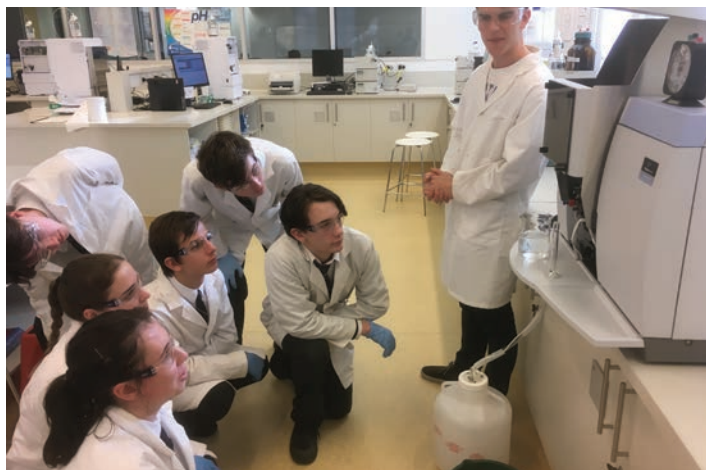

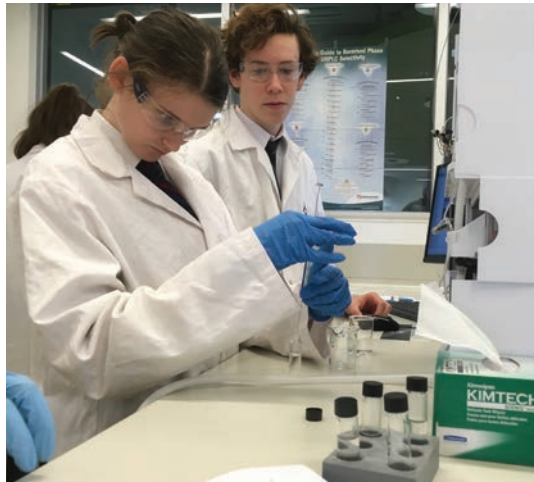
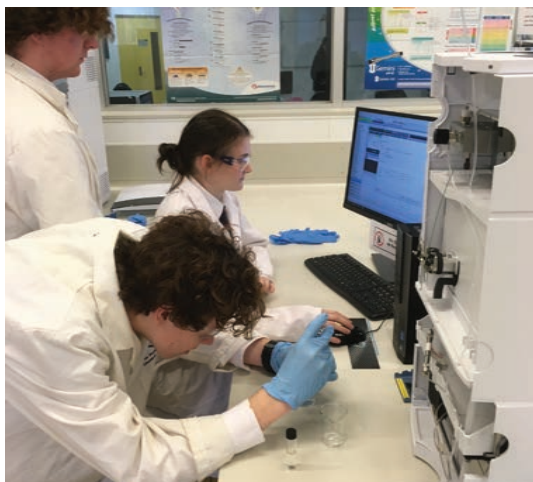

## Year 8 Textiles

Year 8 Textiles students have been making pillowcases. First they dyed a piece of white poplin using a dye called Sun Dye. You paint the dye on the material then place objects on the material such as leaves, flowers, paper cut outs etc. The dyed material is then placed in the sun for a few hours. The areas that are exposed to the sun are dyed a darker colour, resulting in paler shapes left behind to decorate the material. Students then designed a patchwork panel, using some or all of their Sun Dye fabric. The patchwork panel was then incorporated into a pillowcase - custom fitted to their own pillow. Students learnt a range of skills including using a sewing machine and iron, measuring and cutting, sewing seams, neatening edges ...and a lot of patience and perseverance!





# PATHWAYS

Hasn't the term gone quickly!

At the end of last term we had a most exciting visit from the RAAF Hornet Simulated which saw about 15 of our students have the best experience in simulated flying. Students got to "fly" planes in to land and take off, as well as being given a taste of what it is like to fly in a Hornet.

And here we are at the end of Term Two.

Importantly, on the 16th of July, the day before your students are required back there will be an opportunity for Year 12 students and their parents to meet with a representative from VTAC. This will be in St Mary's Hall (Cathedral Hall) at 7pm. These sessions are always informative, and, a great way to get a head start on entering preferences for further study in 2019.

The Tertiary Information Service was held on May 16th in our Stadium and began the process for our Year 12s in introducing the requirements for students going on to study.

So far a trickle of students have found me in my office to ask questions about the process, applications for Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) and some other questions regarding university entry. Everyone is most welcome to email for an appointment or phone and we can arrange to meet.

The exciting happening for the last part of the term is that we are attempting to connect with the Australian Taxation Office to do a webinar for the Year 12s about Tax and working for a living. If this is successful then we will be looking to invite the universities in as a digital virtual visit.

Our Year 10s and Year 11 Careers classes are finishing off looking at getting ready for the workforce, checking out Resumes, cover letters and interviewing techniques. From here we will move to looking at the future of work.

It will soon be the time for picking subjects and thinking about what comes next year. Students in Year 10 and 11 should keep an eye on what they think they might like to do in future study and ensure they have the prerequisites.

Best advice in the senior years for choosing subjects is to pick what you like and what you are good at, not what your friends enjoy.

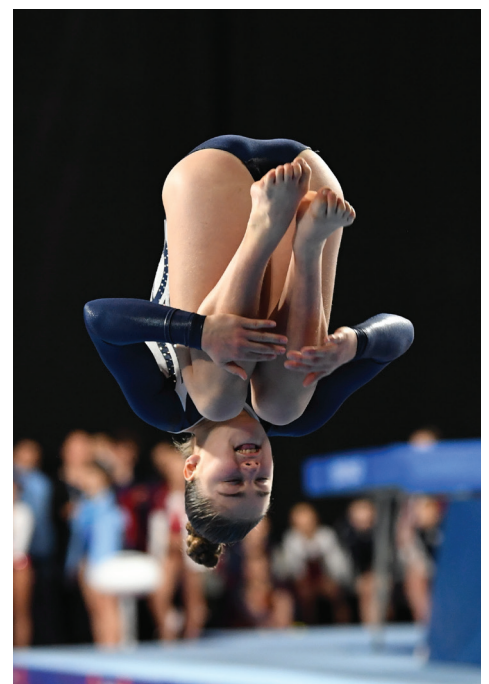
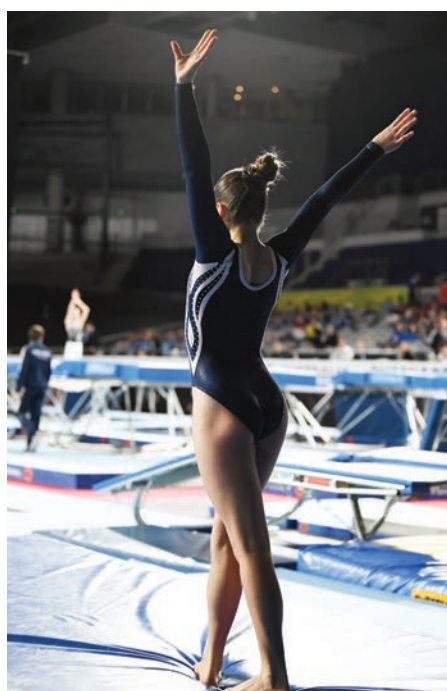

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.
