
following year. Students will start on new learning outcomes and assessment tasks. All Year 8 students will be moved up to the St. Patricks Campus. Student timetables

Wow! I know I have said this before but the year has just flown.

Our Year 12s have moved on and are only waiting to finish their exams before they are in the big wide world of their future.

While we are farewelling them we are not shutting the door on them. Staff will be available at the time the ATARs come out to talk about change of preference and to help with any other problems which may arise. There will also be staff at the College when the first round offers come out if students need to access support. Students who are applying for apprenticeships, traineeships or other work can also come in and talk to the Pathways staff, if they wish to access advice.

Very shortly the College will begin HeadStart and students will be moving to their classes for 2019. This makes it an ideal time to do a quick review of the Careers/Pathways program at the College. Year 10 are usually focussed on the world of work, this includes Work Experience and for some Structured Work Place Learning, resume preparation, writing cover letters and interview practice. They also cover some discussion on the future of work in their ever-changing world.

Years 11 are able to join in discussions about issues in the workplace and to explore the areas of tax, superannuation and credit. Years 12 are encouraged to focus on pathways information and preparation for employment or further study. All year levels are taken through Pathways planning and goal setting.

It will be great to see the cohort of 2019 taking shape through HeadStart and beginning to get ready for a new school year.

Year 8 Mathematics students participated in the 'Great Catapult Challenge'.


In small groups they created their own catapults to participate in a range of catapult challenges around distance and accuracy. There were a range of variables that were considered during the research, design, build and testing stages of the catapult build.

Students were responsible for recording data for their own catapults during the testing phase and used these results to find the ideal parameters required to ensure their machine was at optimal performance during the competition round. They also used this data to predict their own and other group's results over all.

Among the flying mini marshmallows students discovered there was a lot of fun and a lot of math to be had.

In Term 3, our Mathematics student's learnt that sometimes life is about more than just luck. Through the exploration of chance and probability

Year 8 students discovered that sometimes your chance of coming out on top is linked to some strategic moves along the way.

eSafety

Late last term, Rose Basford, Leading Senior Constable from Sale Police, spoke to our Year 7 and 8's about cybersafety and the important laws that protect young people from online bullying, abuse and sharing intimate images with others. The students were shown videos and a PowerPoint presentation outlining the many problems that can arise when young people do not have their social media settings on private and display too much personal information.

Rose also explained the new laws that have recently been introduced regarding intimate images of young people under the age of 18, and how this is viewed as child pornography.

Your child's school will apply for the CSEF on your behalf.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2019 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply at the same school in 2018
- changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019
