It has been a successful first few days of Remote Learning at Catholic College Sale. The level of student attendance and engagement has been exceptional and a big thankyou to our families who are supporting their children and the College in this new method of delivery. Due to the great success we have experienced with Year 12 online teleconferencing through Zoom, we will be rolling out the option of virtual classes to younger year levels next week. We envisage this will provide further options for our teachers to assist with the delivery and engagement for students in their learning programs.

Students should not expect to have a teleconference Zoom class for each lesson. Information regarding how the lesson will be structured will still appear through the Learning Management System SIMON on the student's class notices. If the lesson involves a 'Zoom class', a link to this virtual classroom will be provided via the classroom teacher.

The roll out will be staggered to allow for quick and easy troubleshooting and to assist the College in the management of the Zoom platform.
